INSTRUCTIONS TO BIDDERS

1. LOCATION

The project site for the proposed Work is Park Road in Cape Croker Camp Ground Park Road from the Office Tee to the Beach Y (approximately 600 m), Beach Tee easterly (approximately 25 m) and the Beach Y northerly (approximately 2050 m)

2. SCOPE OF WORK

The Work to be provided by the successful Bidder is generally described as isolated widening, drainage improvements, granular A and paving.

3. TENDER DOCUMENTS, DRAWINGS, ADDENDA & APPENDIX

The Bidder shall verify that these Tender documents are complete and assume responsibility to view/download/print any drawings, specifications, addenda and any related information not sent with this document.

The Chippewas of Nawash Unceded First Nation will issue any changes/additions/deletions to specifications and/or terms and conditions. Any and all addenda issued by the Chippewas of Nawash Unceded First Nation shall form an integral part of the document. The cost of complying with the addenda requirement (if any) shall be included in the price submitted by Bidders. The Chippewas of Nawash Unceded First Nation will assume no responsibility for oral instruction or suggestion.

The Chippewas of Nawash Unceded First Nation will issue any changes/additions/deletions to specifications and/or terms and conditions. Any and all addenda issued by the Chippewas of Nawash Unceded First Nation shall form an integral part of the document. The cost of complying with the addenda requirement (if any) shall be included in the price submitted by bidders. The Chippewas of Nawash Unceded First Nation will assume no responsibility for oral instruction or suggestion.

Each Bidder must satisfy himself, by his own study of the Tender Documents and Drawings, by calculation and by personal inspection of the site respecting the conditions existing or likely to exist in connection with the execution of the Work, as to the practicality of completing the Work successfully within the stipulated time. There will be no consideration of any claim after submission of Tenders that there is a misunderstanding with respect to the conditions imposed in the Contract.

4. **CLARIFICATION**

It shall be the Bidder's responsibility to clarify any detail described in the Tender documents or not mentioned in the Tender documents before submitting its Tender. The prices as tendered, shall include the supply of all labour, equipment and materials, except as otherwise noted, required to do all of the Work and complete the Contract.

Where a Bidder finds discrepancies or omissions in drawings, specifications, or other Tender Documents or instructions, or otherwise requires any clarification, the Bidder should contact the Chippewas of Nawash Unceded First Nation in writing by fax or e-mail to as noted on the Communications Page.

Note that no oral explanation or interpretation shall modify any of the requirements or provisions of the Tender Documents.

Where the Chippewas of Nawash Unceded First Nation deems that an explanation or interpretation is necessary or desirable, an addendum may be issued, in writing, on the Chippewas of Nawash Unceded First Nation 's website for downloading by all bidders. It is the bidder's sole responsibility to check for addenda issued and download same. Acknowledgement of Addenda on the Form of Tender is a mandatory requirement. Failure to acknowledge addenda will result in your tender being deemed non compliant and not eligible for award.

6. RETRIEVAL OF OFFICIAL DOCUMENTATION

Only documents provided to Bidders by the Chippewas of Nawash Unceded First Nation or found on the Chippewas of Nawash Unceded First Nation website are to be considered the "official" documents. The Chippewas of Nawash Unceded First Nation accepts no responsibility for the accuracy of information found on other websites. The onus is on the bidder to check Chippewas of Nawash Unceded First Nation 's website to verify they have received all relevant information. The Chippewas of Nawash Unceded First Nation reserves the right to not accept a bid submission if determined that the documents have been altered from the Chippewas of Nawash Unceded First Nation 's own official documents.

7. <u>DELIVERY AND OFFICIAL CLOSING TIME OF TENDERS</u>

Tenders, sealed in an envelope bearing the Tender Submission Label provided in the Tender Package and name of the firm bidding, will be received by the Chippewas of Nawash Unceded First Nation until the <u>Time and Date Specified on the Cover Page of this Document</u> which time and date shall be considered the Official Closing Time. Tenders received after the Official Closing Time shall not be considered by the Chippewas of Nawash Unceded First Nation . The manner of delivery of any Tender shall be at the risk of the Bidder.

In the event of a discrepancy, the Chippewas of Nawash Unceded First Nation time stamp device shall be the standard of measurement. Tender Deadline Time is defined below:

Tenders received after 2:00:01 pm shall be deemed late and not be accepted.

The Chippewas of Nawash Unceded First Nation is not responsible for Tender submissions which arrive late, are not properly marked, or are delivered to the proper location. Tenders not received and time-stamped by the aforementioned deadline in the aforementioned office will be rejected and returned un-opened.

This is a sealed Tender. All Tenders shall be submitted in a sealed envelope or package with the submission label as provided from the Chippewas of Nawash Unceded First Nation firmly affixed to the outside of the envelope or package. All envelopes or packages must have bidder's name and address where indicated and envelopes must be sealed.

Tenders must be delivered to the Band Administration Office as specified on the Cover Sheet of this document.

Each Tender shall be marked by the Chippewas of Nawash Unceded First Nation with the time and date it is received. The Chippewas of Nawash Unceded First Nation will open the Tenders publicly at the Municipal office, following the Official

Closing Time.

8. TENDER SUBMISSION

All Sections of the Tender Documents must be completed in ink, with all of the blank spaces completed. All items shall be tendered according to instructions in the Tender Documents, with entries made for unit price, lump sums, extensions and totals as appropriate.

9. WITHDRAWAL OR ALTERATION OF TENDERS

A Bidder that has submitted a Tender may submit a further Tender at any time up to the Official Closing Time. The last Tender received shall supersede and invalidate all tenders previously submitted by that Bidder for the work.

A Bidder may withdraw their Tender at any time up to the tender submission time.

The Bidder's name and contract number shall be shown on the envelope containing such letter. Once tender opening has begun, all tenders are valid unless found to be Informal or Unbalanced.

Alterations to the Bidder's numerical entries may be made to Tenders not yet submitted prior to the Official Closing Time, provided they are legible and initialed by the Bidder's authorized officer.

10. INFORMAL AND UNBALANCED TENDERS

Tenders which are incomplete, conditional, illegible or obscure, or that contain additions, reservations, erasures, qualifications, alterations incorrectly submitted or irregularities of any kind will result in an invalid Tender and will be rejected by the Chippewas of Nawash Unceded First Nation .

Where a Tender process contains a requirement to identify a proposed construction duration and/or Work period, Tenders that are based upon an unreasonable duration or period of time to achieve the completion of the Work and as consequence of such schedule, results in greater overall project costs to the Chippewas of Nawash Unceded First Nation , or results in scheduling conflicts as may be specified elsewhere in the contract, such as, but not limited to: school bus routes, fisheries, issues and/or winter construction issues not anticipated, may be rejected by the Chippewas of Nawash Unceded First Nation , as the Chippewas of Nawash Unceded First Nation may determine within its sole discretion.

Wherever in a Tender the contract total for an item does not agree with the extension of the contract quantity and the unit price, the unit price will be deemed to be correct and the total price revised accordingly.

The Chippewas of Nawash Unceded First Nation will correct mathematical discrepancies as the Chippewas of Nawash Unceded First Nation may determine acting reasonably. In all cases, where an error is made in extending the unit price, the unit price shall determine the item total. Accordingly, where a unit price is shown, the value shall not be zero unless the item total is zero. Where an error has been made in transferring an amount from one part of the Tender to another, the amount shown before transfer shall, subject to any corrections made as above, be taken to be correct and the transferred amount and the total Tender prices shall be corrected accordingly.

Tenders that contain prices which appear to be so unbalanced as likely to adversely affect the interests of the Chippewas of Nawash Unceded First Nation may be rejected by the Chippewas of Nawash Unceded First Nation , as the Chippewas of Nawash Unceded First Nation may determine within its sole discretion.

Bidders that have submitted Tenders that have been rejected by the Chippewas of Nawash Unceded First Nation for any of the above-noted reasons will be notified of the reason(s) for such rejection within ten days of the Official Closing Time.

11. TENDER SECURITY

A <u>Tender Security</u> is required to accompany the Tender in the <u>amount \$50,000</u> in one of or a combination of the following: Certified cheque, bank draft or money order made payable to the Chippewas of Nawash Unceded First Nation . A bid bond or letter of credit shall not be accepted as a Tender Security.

The Bidder agrees that if he should withdraw his Tender or fail for any reason to execute the agreement or provide the required bonds or other documents required, the Chippewas of Nawash Unceded First Nation may retain the Tender security for the use of the Chippewas of Nawash Unceded First Nation and may accept any other Tender; advertise for new Tenders; or not accept any Tender as the Chippewas of Nawash Unceded First Nation deems advisable.

The Tender security of the low and second low Bidder shall be retained by the Chippewas of Nawash Unceded First Nation for a period of 90 days after the official closing time or until a contract has been executed by the low Bidder. The Tender deposit of the low and second low Bidder shall be returned by the Chippewas of Nawash Unceded First Nation upon execution of a contract by the awarded Bidder. The Tender securities of all other Bidders shall be returned within 10 days of the official closing time.

The Tender security of the low Bidder shall be forfeited where the Bidder fails to return to the Chippewas of Nawash Unceded First Nation, within 10 days of receipt of the acceptance of its Tender, the executed contract and other documents required by the Chippewas of Nawash Unceded First Nation.

12. BONDING REQUIREMENTS

The Bidder shall include with its Tender an Agreement to Bond as per the format enclosed, executed under corporate seal by the Surety Company from which the Bidder proposes to obtain the required bonds. Only bonds issued by a Guarantee Surety Company authorized by law to carry on business in the Province of Ontario and having an office in Ontario shall be accepted.

Prior to the execution of a Contract with the Chippewas of Nawash Unceded First Nation , the Bidder shall be required to provide to the Chippewas of Nawash Unceded First Nation a Performance Bond and a Labour and Materials Payment Bond, each in the amount of 100% of the total Tender Price (including GST). The full cost of such bonds shall be deemed to be included in the total Tender Price for the Contract. The Surety Bonds shall be in accordance with the latest edition of the CCDC approved bond forms.

13. INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS

The successful Bidder will be required to provide a certificate of insurance for policies covering the types of insurance required under the General Conditions of Contract or Supplementary General Conditions. Applicable to the Works, the minimum amount shall be \$5,000,000 (five million) exclusive of interest and cost with the executed Contract.

The insurance policies shall cover the Contractor, their Sub-Contractors, Chippewas of Nawash Unceded First Nation and the Chippewas of Nawash Unceded First Nation 's agent as if a separate policy had been issued to each. The Certificate of Insurance shall name the Chippewas of Nawash Unceded First Nation as an additional insured.

Any property damage deductible shall be the responsibility of the Contractor, in accordance with the OPS General Conditions of Contract. (Metric OPSS. MUNI 100).

In addition to the above requirements, the Contractor shall take out a policy of Environmental Pollution Liability Insurance (or other similar policy, such as Contractors' Pollution Liability Insurance) with a limit of not less than \$2 million on either a claims-made or occurrence basis covering the Contractor, their Sub-Contractors, Chippewas of Nawash Unceeded First Nation and the Chippewas of Nawash Unceeded First Nation's agents while operating or performing work at the location for the duration of this contract.

In addition to the above requirements, if blasting operations are used under the Contract, the Contractor shall take out and keep in force a separate insurance policy providing coverage for blasting operations to the same limits as set out in the General Conditions of Contract including coverage as indicated above.

14. WORKPLACE SAFETY AND INSURANCE BOARD (WSIB)

The successful Bidder will be required to provide a current copy of their WSIB Clearance Certificate with the executed contract and at any time during the course of the contract.

The successful Bidder will be required to provide a current copy of their WSIB MAP, CAD-7, NEER Annual Statement as appropriate with the executed contract.

15. ACCESSIBILITY FOR ONTARIANS WITH DISABILITIES ACT, 2005 (AODA)

New requirements of the AODA passed by the Ontario Legislature with the goal of creating standards to improve accessibility across the Province are now in effect. All private sector organizations in Ontario were required to comply with the customer Service Standards by January 1, 2012.

Businesses and individuals that the Chippewas of Nawash Unceded First Nation has contracted to provide goods or services to customers must ensure that their employees, agents and subcontractors are trained on providing accessible customer service. All vendors will be required to complete the Chippewas of Nawash Unceded First Nation 's Accessibility Compliance Form as a one-time registration in order to do work on behalf of the Chippewas of Nawash Unceded First Nation . The successful bidder will be required to provide a completed AODA Form with the executed contract.

ONTARIO REGULATIONS 429/07 (Accessible Standards for Customer Service)

In accordance with section 6 of Ontario Regulation 429/07, Accessible Standards for Customer Service, the contractor is responsible to ensure that all of its employees, volunteers, and others for which the contractor is responsible are adequately trained.

16. CORPORATE HEALTH & SAFETY POLICY

The successful Bidder will be required to provide a copy of their Health and Safety Policy including their program of implementation of this policy.

Under the Duties of Employer and Other Persons, (Section 25(2)(j) of the Occupational Health and Safety Act) the Act states:

(2)Idem - Without limiting the strict duty imposed by subsection 1, an employer shall;

(j) prepare and review at least annually a written occupational health and safety policy and develop and maintain a program to implement the policy.

This section of the *Occupational Health and Safety Act* is clear. An employer is required to have the above in place no matter how small or large a business. The Chippewas of Nawash Unceded First Nation requires that this information be part of the <u>required documentation</u> for contract award.

The contractor shall indemnify and hold harmless the owner, their agents and employees for any contravention's of the *Occupational Health and Safety Act*, (most current legislation) and for all legal costs incurred in the event that charges are brought against the owner pursuant to the act.

17. INDEMNIFICATION AND DAMAGES

The successful Bidder agrees to indemnify and save harmless the Chippewas of Nawash Unceded First Nation from and against all claims, demands, losses, costs, damages, actions, suits, or other proceeding by any third party against the Chippewas of Nawash Unceded First Nation resulting from any act, omission or failure of the Bidder during and after the procurement process, including during the performance of the Work.

Any loss or damage to the Work caused by the action of the elements, including severe rainstorms, windstorms, floods or any other unforeseen circumstances shall be sustained and borne by the Constructor at his own expense. All material and additional Work required to make good any loss or damage to Work previously completed shall be borne at the cost of the Constructor and no claims for extra payment will be considered.

18. BIDDER'S ABILITY AND EXPERIENCE FORM

Bidders shall complete the "Bidder's Ability and Experience Form" found in Section 5. They shall:

- Disclose their legal status (Federal, Provincial or foreign corporation, a partnership, a limited liability partnership or sole proprietorship)
- State the names and addresses of the responsible officers, partners or individuals as the case may be.
- Furnish satisfactory evidence that they have the requisite ability and experience (with references) in the class of work contemplated and sufficient capital and plant to enable them to complete the work successfully within the time stated in the Tender.

19. MANDATORY CRITERIA

It is the intention of the Chippewas of Nawash Unceded First Nation to enter into a Contract to undertake the Work as defined in the Tender Documents with a Bidder that meets all of the mandatory requirements. The mandatory requirements will be evaluated on a pass/fail basis. Where a Bidder fails to pass any mandatory criterion, the Bidder's Tender will be considered non-compliant and will not be considered further.

Bidders must provide documentation/evidence for each mandatory criterion, where requested. Failure to provide such documentation/evidence will make a Tender non-compliant and will be disqualified.

20. ACCEPTANCE, REJECTION AND PERIOD OF VALIDITY OF TENDERS

The Chippewas of Nawash Unceded First Nation reserves the right to reject any or all Tenders and the lowest-priced Tender will not necessarily be accepted.

The Bidders acknowledge that the Work, or portions thereof, are subject to the procurement and issuance of certain permits, authorizations, licenses, easements and other approvals as may be required from third parties, including but not limited to Grey Sauble Conservation Authority, the Ministry of the Environment, the Ministry of Transportation and Rail Authorities, under applicable laws, statutes and regulations in order to commence and perform the Work. Approvals and/or permits from the above mentioned authorities, if required, have been applied for and are in process.

In the event, any such Approvals are not issued in order to permit commencement or performance of the Work, the Cape Croker Park Ground reserves the right to either:

- Not award the Contract and cancel the Call for Tenders; or
- Award the Contract in whole or in part, subject to the right of the Chippewas of Nawash Unceded First Nation to cancel all or part of the Contract at any time after award in the event any required approvals cannot be obtained; or
- Delay the consideration of the award of the Contract until such time as the required Approvals have been obtained

Notwithstanding any requirement, the Chippewas of Nawash Unceded First Nation reserves the right to cancel or defer the work at its sole discretion where the costs exceed the Chippewas of Nawash Unceded First Nation 's budget to a degree that the project is not viable, or where it appears, in the Chippewas of Nawash Unceded First Nation 's sole discretion, that any permissions or

approvals required from external agencies to complete the work will not be forthcoming in a reasonable period of time, and as a consequence of such a delay, will affect the construction window and/or anticipated weather conditions to a degree that will have impact upon the construction costs or other aspects of the Work. The award of this tender is subject to approval by Chippewas of Nawash Unceded First Nation Band Council.

The Chippewas of Nawash Unceded First Nation reserves the right to not accept a tender from any person or corporation which includes all related corporations who, or which, has a claim or instituted a legal proceeding against the Chippewas of Nawash Unceded First Nation or against whom the Chippewas of Nawash Unceded First Nation has a claim or instituted a legal proceeding with respect to any previous contracts, bid submissions or business transactions who is justified as either the proposed Contractor or Subcontractor within the submitted tender.

The Bidder acknowledges that it shall have no claim against the Chippewas of Nawash Unceded First Nation, or entitlement to damages from the Chippewas of Nawash Unceded First Nation because of the Chippewas of Nawash Unceded First Nation 's rejection of its Tender, or as a result of any delay in the acceptance or rejection of a Tender.

NEGOTIATION The Chippewas of Nawash Unceded First Nation reserves the right to negotiate with the lowest compliant bidder.

The Chippewas of Nawash Unceded First Nation may increase the extent of the project limits beyond station 2+050.

21. <u>CHIPPEWAS OF NAWASH UNCEDED FIRST NATION PURCHASING POLICY</u>

The Bidders and Contractor shall comply with the Chippewas of Nawash Unceeded First Nation purchasing Policy. FORMATION OF CONTRACT

Upon notifying the successful Bidder that their Tender has been accepted, the successful Bidder shall provide, within ten (10) days of receipt, the following documents to be included in the contract:

- Performance and Labour & Material Bonds, as specified;
- Current WSIB Clearance Certificate, MAP, CAD-7, NEER Annual Statement as appropriate;

- Contractor Acknowledgement Form; and
- Required Certificates of Insurance.

Upon receipt, the Chippewas of Nawash Unceded First Nation shall forward three (3) copies of the Contract Documents for execution. Once the Contract has been executed, the Bidder shall be referred to as the Contractor.

23. HARMONIZED SALES TAX NOT APPLICABLE

24. BIDDERS INVESTIGATION/EXAMINATION/SITE INSPECTION

Bidders may visit the site of the Work and carefully investigate all conditions potentially affecting the Work and how it is to be completed, with respect to site access, working area, storage areas, local features including private property and utilities, as well as any other conditions that may influence the undertaking and/or pricing of the Work.

Further, the Bidder shall examine all Tender Documents, specifications, drawings and reports to ensure that the Scope of Work and the conditions of the Contract are clear.

The Bidder may carry out such further investigations as are necessary to inform him of the subsurface conditions, which will be encountered in Construction of the Works. The arrangements for such investigations should be made with the Chippewas of Nawash Unceded First Nation and any other appropriate authorities.

The Chippewas of Nawash Unceded First Nation has made no arrangements with private owners for site investigations to be carried out by prospective Bidders. If any person proposes to carry out any investigation on any property relative to the proposed Works, he shall, before entering the said property, and any other property for the purpose of obtaining access to the said property, and before commencing the said investigation, contact each owner and occupant of the said properties and advise them of the nature and extent of the proposed investigation and obtain an agreement in writing thereto of all such owners and occupants.

The person (or firm) who was responsible for carrying out such an investigation or for making use of any access as aforesaid shall reinstate promptly all property which has been disturbed by such investigation or by use of such access and shall be responsible for all damage and claims resulting there from in accordance with the said agreement of such owners and occupants.

With respect to any matter referred to in the foregoing paragraph, no person referred to therein is authorized to act as agent of or to make any representation on behalf of the Chippewas of Nawash Unceded First Nation and the Chippewas of Nawash Unceded First Nation shall not be responsible for any disturbance to

or reinstatement of any property or for any damage or claims referred to therein.

The Bidder waives any claim for additional payment resulting from conditions that could have been reasonably foreseen by the Bidder or determined by the investigation or examinations described above.

The Bidder may, upon application to the Chippewas of Nawash Unceded First Nation, perform investigation or testing of the site at the Chippewas of Nawash Unceded First Nation's discretion.

25. **SUB-CONTRACTING**

Following acceptance of the Tender, the successful Bidder shall not, without written approval of the Chippewas of Nawash Unceded First Nation, make any arrangements or any sub-contract for the execution of any service hereby quoted on other than as described in their Tender.

It shall be a condition of the Contract that the successful Bidder shall be required to carry out, using his own forces, the minimum amount of Fifty percent (50%) of the total Work assigned. The successful Bidder shall not sub-contract more than Fifty percent (50%) of the assigned Work.

26. MATERIALS

All materials (except as specifically indicated in the Special Provisions) required on this Contract shall be new, un-used, not re-manufactured.

27. FAIR WAGE

The Contractor must abide by the applicable "Fair Wage Schedule" and any amendments there to, as approved and/or adopted by the authority having jurisdiction (The Province of Ontario) and in place at the time of the work.

28. MANDATORY SITE MEETING A MANDATORY SITE MEETING WILL BE HELD ON JULY 16 AT

1:00 pm at the Cape Croker Camp Ground Administration Office. The purpose of the meeting is to review the tender and to make a site inspection of the right of way.

BIDS WILL ONLY BE ACCEPTED BY CONTRACTORS WHO HAVE A REPRESENTATIVE ATTEND THIS MEETING.

29. <u>MUNICIPAL FREEDOM OF INFORMATION AND PROTECTION OF PRIVACY ACT (MFIPPA)</u>

The Municipal Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act, as it relates to municipalities and local boards came into force on January 1, 1991. It sets out certain rules regarding the disclosure to third parties of information held by municipalities and local boards

If you wish any or all of the documents that you submit to the Chippewas of Nawash Unceded First Nation as part of this Tender to be protected from disclosure under the above legislation, please provide a signed letter enclosed with the Tender outlining the parts of the Tender to be protected. This letter will not guarantee that there will never be disclosure, but it does lay the groundwork for handling an application for disclosure by a third party under this legislation.

The successful Bidder shall keep daily activity logs including but not limited to the date of service, maintenance details, weather conditions and any other information deemed to be relevant to protect itself against potential litigation.




Drawing 2 - Office Tee to Beach Y Typical

Drawing 6 - Intersecting Road Typical



Drawing 5 - Beach Y to the Last One Ditch Clean Out Typical


