



WHO IS AT RISK

Any individual who has had close, direct contact with a person with monkeypox are at risk of acquiring the infection. We ask that any Nawash community members experiencing symptoms to self-isolate at home and contact our Health Centre immediately.

According to Public Health monkeypox infections are usually mild with most people recovering on their own within 2-4 weeks. However, the virus can cause severe illness and even death in cases.

Symptoms:

Symptoms of monkeypox usually **begin five to 21 days after exposure** and occur in two stages, according to the health unit.

- 1. **Stage 1 symptoms** may include fever, chills, headache, muscle pain, swollen lymph nodes and lethargy.
- 2. **During the second stage**, a rash or lesions may develop, usually one to three days after the fever begins.

How is it spread?

Monkeypox can spread from person to person through close contact with an infected person's bodily fluids or lesions, it can also be transmitted when a person comes into contact with contaminated clothing or bedding.

The Public Health Unit said a person is considered infectious from the start of their symptoms until the rash has crusted over and the scabs have dried up and fallen off.

The Public Health Unit advises all symptomatic individuals to selfisolate at home. Anyone diagnosed must isolate until all scabs have healed.
