



# FIRST NATIONS DRINKING WATER SETTLEMENT / CLASS ACTION

INDIVIDUAL CLAIM

## ABOUT THE LAWSUIT

The lawsuit addresses Canada's failure to take all reasonable steps to ensure that First Nation communities have adequate access to safe drinking water.

The Settlement includes compensation for Impacted First Nations and eligible individuals as well as commitments to fund the construction, operation, and maintenance of infrastructure needed to provide regular access to safe drinking water in their homes in a quantity sufficient for everyday use including, laundry, cooking, washing dishes, bathing, etc.

The First Nations Drinking Water settlement totals roughly \$8 billion. \$6 billion is for community water and wastewater infrastructure and the rest is compensation for both Individuals and First Nations.

Courts have approved the Settlement between Canada and certain First Nations and their members who were subject to a drinking water advisory that lasted at least one year between November 20, 1995 and June 20, 2021.

## ELIGIBILITY

In Neyaashiinigiing, we have had a boil water advisory since 2019.

In order to be **eligible** for this action, a member needs to be living in Nawash between:  
**January 21, 2019 to June 20, 2021.**

## UPDATE: DEADLINE

Individuals can make a claim for compensation by **March 7, 2023**, using the **Individual Claim Form**.
